



History of Fraserview Tuesday Women's Golf Club

The original Fraserview Golf Course clubhouse was built in 1938 and later relocated and renovated in 1998 as part of a comprehensive course redevelopment. Originally named "Fraser," the course was officially renamed "Fraserview" by the Vancouver Park Board in 1943.

The Fraserview Tuesday Women's Club was founded on February 10, 1948, when the first official meeting was held at 8:00 PM in the clubhouse. Twenty women attended, and sixteen became founding members. During this meeting, a formal request for membership was sent to the Canadian Ladies' Golf Union (C.L.G.U.) in Toronto. Electa Pollock was appointed as the club's first Captain. To help guide operations, the women were provided with a copy of the Men's Club Charter Rules for reference.

Initially, women's play was scheduled for Sundays. However, in 1952, Ladies' Day was officially moved to Tuesday, a tradition that continues today. At that time, the annual membership fee was \$5.00, with an additional \$0.50 fee for team players.

Today, the club maintains an annual membership of approximately 85 women and has proudly upheld its legacy since 1948. We remain dedicated to empowering women, fostering friendships, and celebrating our shared passion for golf.
